

AGREEMENT FOR STORMWATER PIPELINE INSPECTION, MAINTENANCE, AND CLEANING SERVICES

THIS AGREEMENT FOR STORMWATER PIPELINE INSPECTION, MAINTENANCE, AND CLEANING SERVICES ("Agreement") is entered into by and between the <u>CITY OF OCALA</u>, a Florida municipal corporation ("City"), and <u>ENVIROWASTE SERVICES GROUP, INC.</u>, a for profit corporation duly organized and authorized to do business in the State of Florida (EIN: 65-0829090) ("Contractor").

<u>RECITALS</u>:

WHEREAS, on May 4, 2020, City issued an Invitation to Bid ("ITB") for the provision of video inspection, cleaning, Ground Penetrating Radar, and ground sealing services for the City's stormwater pipeline system, ITB No.: PWD/200222 (the "Solicitation"); and

WHEREAS, seven (7) firms responded to the Solicitation and, after consideration of price and other evaluation factors set forth in the Solicitation, the bid submitted by EnviroWaste Services Group, Inc. was found to be the highest ranked bid as scored by City; and

WHEREAS, EnviroWaste Services Group, Inc. was chosen as the intended awardee to provide video inspection, cleaning, Ground Penetrating Radar, and ground sealing services for the City's stormwater pipeline system (the "Project"); and

WHEREAS, Contractor certifies that Contractor and its subcontractors are qualified and possess the required licensure and skill to perform the work required for the Project; and

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the foregoing recitals, the following mutual covenants and conditions, and other good and valuable consideration, City and Contractor agree as follows:

TERMS OF AGREEMENT:

- 1. **RECITALS**. City and Contractor hereby represent, warrant, and agree that the Recitals set forth above are true and correct and are incorporated herein by reference.
- 2. CONTRACT DOCUMENTS. The Contract Documents which comprise the entire understanding between City and Contractor shall only include: (a) this Agreement; (b) those documents listed in this section as Exhibits to this Agreement; (c) the City's Solicitation for the Project and the bid submitted by Contractor in response to same (the "Solicitation Documents"); and (d) those documents identified in the Project Specifications section of this Agreement, if any. Each of these documents are incorporated herein by reference for all purposes.



If there is a conflict between the terms of this Agreement and the Contract Documents, then the terms of this Agreement shall control, amend, and supersede any conflicting terms contained in the remaining Contract Documents.

- A. Exhibits to Agreement: The Exhibits to this Agreement are as follows:
 - Exhibit A: Scope of Work (A-1 through A-7)

Exhibit B: Price Proposal (B-1 through B-2)

If there is a conflict between the individual Exhibits regarding the scope of work to be performed, then any identified inconsistency shall be resolved by giving precedence in the following order: (1) Exhibit A, then (2) Exhibit B.

- B. **Project Specifications**: This project will require the Contractor to have the following specifications and documents, which are incorporated by reference:
 - i. Florida Department of Transportation Standard Specifications for Road and Bridge Construction (latest edition) available at: http://www.fdot.gov/programmanagement/Implemented/SpecBooks/.
 - ii. Florida Department of Transportation Design Standards (latest edition) available at: http://www.fdot.gov/roadway/DS/18/STDs.shtm.

If there is a conflict between the individual Project Specifications regarding the scope of work to be performed, then any identified inconsistency shall be resolved by giving precedents to the most restrictive specification.

- 3. SCOPE OF SERVICES. Contractor shall provide all materials, labor, supervision, tools, accessories, equipment, permits, certifications, incidentals and all other things necessary for Contractor to perform its obligations under this Agreement as set forth in the attached Exhibit A Scope of Work and the Solicitation Documents. The Scope of Work under this Agreement may only be adjusted by written amendment executed by both parties.
- 4. COMPENSATION. City shall pay Contractor a maximum limiting amount not to exceed <u>ONE</u> <u>HUNDRED FIFTY THOUSAND AND NO/100 DOLLARS (\$150,000)</u> (the "Contract Sum") as full and complete compensation for the timely and satisfactory completion of the work in compliance with the unit prices set forth in **Exhibit B – Price Proposal** and the Contract Documents. The pricing under this Agreement may only be adjusted by written amendment executed by both parties.
 - A. **Monthly Progress Payments**: The compensation amount under this section shall be paid by City, monthly, based upon a percentage of completion of the work as invoiced by Contractor and approved by City. The compensation sought under this Agreement is



subject to the express terms of this Agreement and any applicable federal and/or state laws.

- B. **Project Schedule and Progress Reports**. A progress report and updated project schedule must be submitted with each monthly pay request indicating the percent of services completed to date. This report will serve as support for payment to Contractor and the basis for payment in the event project is suspended or abandoned.
- C. Invoice Submission. All invoices submitted by Contractor shall include the City Contract Number, an assigned Invoice Number, and an Invoice Date. Contractor shall be provided with a cover sheet for invoicing. This cover sheet must be filled out correctly and submitted with each invoice. Contractor shall submit the original invoice through the responsible City Project Manager at: City of Ocala Public Works Department, Attn: Brian Herrick, E-Mail: bherrick@ocalafl.org, Telephone (352) 351-6733.
- D. **Payment of Invoices by City**. The City Project Manager must review and approve all invoices prior to payment. City Project Manager's approval shall not be unreasonably withheld, conditioned, or delayed. Payments by City shall be made no later than the time periods established in section 218.735, Florida Statutes.
- E. Withholding of Payment. City reserves the right to withhold, in whole or in part, payment for any and all work that: (i) has not been completed by Contractor; (ii) is inadequate or defective and has not been remedied or resolved in a manner satisfactory to the City Project Manager; or (iii) which fails to comply with any term, condition, or other requirement under this Agreement. Any payment withheld shall be released and remitted to Contractor within <u>THIRTY (30)</u> calendar days of the Contractor's remedy or resolution of the inadequacy or defect.
- F. Excess Funds. If due to mistake or any other reason Contractor receives payment under this Agreement in excess of what is provided for by the Agreement, Contractor shall promptly notify City upon discovery of the receipt of the overpayment. Any overpayment shall be refunded to City within <u>THIRTY (30)</u> days of Contractor's receipt of the overpayment or must also include interest calculated from the date of the overpayment at the interest rate for judgments at the highest rate as allowed by law.
- G. **Tax Exemption**. City is exempt from all federal excise and state sales taxes (State of Florida Consumer's Certification of Exemption 85-8012621655C-9). The City's Employer Identification Number is 59-60000392. Contractor shall not be exempted from paying sales tax to its suppliers for materials to fulfill contractual obligations with the City, nor



will Contractor be authorized to use City's Tax Exemption Number for securing materials listed herein.

- 5. **TIME FOR PERFORMANCE**. Time is of the essence with respect to the performance of all duties, obligations, and responsibilities set forth in this Agreement and the Contract Documents.
 - A. Effective Date and Term. This Agreement shall become effective and commence on <u>JULY 14, 2020</u> and continue for a term of <u>THREE (3)</u> years, through and including <u>July</u> <u>13, 2023</u>. This Agreement may be renewed for up to <u>TWO (2)</u> additional <u>ONE YEAR (1-Year)</u> terms by written consent between City and Contractor.
 - B. Work Orders and Work Schedules for Individual Projects. City shall issue written Work Orders for individual projects. Contractor shall submit a work schedule prior to beginning work under any Work Order. <u>FIVE (5)</u> days prior to the commencement of work, Contractor shall provide proper notice to all residents within the designated work area as to the dates of work and the level of inconvenience that will be involved. In the event that Contractor determines that a work schedule variance is necessary, Contractor shall consult with and obtain approval from City Project Manager no less than <u>TWENTY-FOUR</u> (24) hours in advance. At no time will the Contractor be allowed to lag behind.
 - C. Contractor shall provide written notice of completion of the work to City Project Manager.
 City Project Manager shall make a final inspection and provide Contractor with written notice of any project deficiencies. Contractor shall correct all deficiencies within <u>SEVEN</u>
 (7) working days of notification.
 - D. The Time for Performance under this Agreement may only be adjusted by Change Order, in the sole and absolute discretion of City. Any request for an extension of the Time for Performance must be submitted in a writing delivered to the City Project Manager. All requests for adjustments in the Contract Time shall be determined by City.
 - E. As to any delay, inefficiency, or interference in this performance of this Agreement caused by any act or failure to act by City, the Contractor's sole remedy shall be the entitlement of an extension of time to complete the performance of the affected work in accordance with the Contract Documents. Contractor agrees to make no claim for extra or additional costs attributable to said delays, inefficiencies or interference, except as provided in this Agreement.
 - F. None of the provisions of this section shall exclude City's right of recovery for damages caused by delays or inefficiencies caused by any act or failure to act by Contractor, to include costs incurred by City for the procurement of additional professional services.



6. FORCE MAJEURE. Neither party shall be liable for delay, damage, or failure in the performance of any obligation under this Agreement if such delay, damage, or failure is due to causes beyond its reasonable control, including without limitation: fire, flood, strikes and labor disputes, acts of war, acts of nature, terrorism, civil unrest, pandemics, acts or delays in acting of the government of the United States or the several states, judicial orders, decrees or restrictions, or any other like reason which is beyond the control of the respective party ("Force Majeure"). The party affected by any event of force majeure shall use reasonable efforts to remedy, remove, or mitigate such event and the effects thereof with all reasonable dispatch.

The party affected by force majeure shall provide the other party with full particulars thereof including, but not limited to, the nature, details, and expected duration thereof, as soon as it becomes aware.

When force majeure circumstances arise, the parties shall negotiate in good faith any modifications of the terms of this Agreement that may be necessary or appropriate in order to arrive at an equitable solution. Contractor performance shall be extended for a number of days equal to the duration of the force majeure. Contractor shall be entitled to an extension of time only and, in no event, shall Contractor be entitled to any increased costs, additional compensation, or damages of any type resulting from such force majeure delays.

- 7. **INSPECTION AND ACCEPTANCE OF THE WORK**. Contractor shall report its progress to the City Project Manager as set forth herein. All services, work, and materials provided by Contractor under this Agreement shall be provided to the satisfaction and approval of the Project Manager.
 - A. The Project Manager shall decide all questions regarding the quality, acceptability, and/or fitness of materials furnished, or workmanship performed, the rate of progress of the work, the interpretation of the plans and specifications, and the acceptable fulfillment of the Agreement, in his or her sole discretion, based upon both the requirements set forth by City and the information provided by Contractor in its Proposal. The authority vested in the Project Manager pursuant to this paragraph shall be confined to the direction or specification of what is to be performed under this Agreement and shall not extend to the actual execution of the work.
 - B. Neither the Project Manager's review of Contractor's work nor recommendations made by Project Manager pursuant to this Agreement will impose on Project Manager any responsibility to supervise, direct, or control Contractor's work in progress or for the



means, methods, techniques, sequences, or procedures of construction or safety precautions or programs incident Contractor's furnishing and performing the work.

- 8. **TERMINATION AND DEFAULT**. Either party, upon determination that the other party has failed or refused to perform or is otherwise in breach of any obligation or provision under this Agreement or the Contract Document, may give written notice of default to the defaulting party in the manner specified for the giving of notices herein. Termination of this Agreement by either party for any reason shall have no effect upon the rights or duties accruing to the parties prior to termination.
 - A. **Termination by City for Cause**. City shall have the right to terminate this Agreement immediately, in whole or in part, upon the failure of Contractor to carry out any obligation, term, or condition of this Agreement. City's election to terminate the Agreement for default shall be communicated by providing Contractor written notice of termination in the manner specified for the giving of notices herein. Any notice of termination given to Contractor by City shall be effective immediately, unless otherwise provided therein, upon the occurrence of any one or more of the following events:
 - (1) Contractor fails to timely and properly perform any of the services set forth in the specifications of the Agreement;
 - (2) Contractor provides material that does not meet the specifications of the Agreement;
 - (3) Contractor fails to complete the work required within the time stipulated in the Agreement; or
 - (4) Contractor fails to make progress in the performance of the Agreement and/or gives City reason to believe that Contractor cannot or will not perform to the requirements of the Agreement.
 - B. **Contractor's Opportunity to Cure Default**. City may, in its sole discretion, provide Contractor with an opportunity to cure the violations set forth in City's notice of default to Contractor. Contractor shall commence to cure the violations immediately and shall diligently and continuously prosecute such cure to completion within a reasonable time as determined by City. If the violations are not corrected within the time determined to be reasonable by City or to the reasonable satisfaction of City, City may, without further notice, declare Contractor to be in breach of this Agreement and pursue all remedies available at law or equity, to include termination of this Agreement without further notice.

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- C. **City's Remedies Upon Contractor Default**. In the event that Contractor fails to cure any default under this Agreement within the time period specified in this section, City may pursue any remedies available at law or equity, including, without limitation, the following:
 - (1) City shall be entitled to terminate this Agreement without further notice;
 - (2) City shall be entitled to hire another contractor to complete the required work in accordance with the needs of City;
 - (3) City shall be entitled to recover from Contractor all damages, costs, and attorney's fees arising from Contractor's default prior to termination; and
 - (4) City shall be entitled to recovery from Contractor any actual excess costs by: (i) deduction from any unpaid balances owed to Contractor; or (ii) placing a claim against the performance bond; or (iii) any other remedy as provided by law.
- D. **Termination for Convenience**. City reserves the right to terminate this Agreement in whole or in part at any time for the convenience of City without penalty or recourse. The Project Manager shall provide written notice of the termination. Upon receipt of the notice, Contractor shall immediately discontinue all work as directed in the notice, notify all subcontractors of the effective date of the termination, and minimize all further costs to City including, but not limited to, the placing of any and all orders for materials, facilities, or supplies, in connection with its performance under this Agreement. Contractor shall be entitled to receive compensation solely for: (1) the actual cost of the work completed in conformity with this Agreement; and/or (2) such other costs incurred by Contractor as permitted under this Agreement and approved by City.
- 9. DELAYS AND DAMAGES. The Contractor agrees to make no claim for extra or additional costs attributable to any delays, inefficiencies, or interference in the performance of this contract occasioned by any act or omission to act by the City except as provided in the Agreement. The Contractor also agrees that any such delay, inefficiency, or interference shall be compensated for solely by an extension of time to complete the performance of the work in accordance with the provision in the standard specification.
- 10. WARRANTY. Contractor warrants that all labor, materials, and equipment furnished under the agreement are new, of the type and quality required for the Project, and installed in a good and workmanlike manner in accordance with the Contract Documents. Contractor shall guarantee that the work shall be free from any defects in workmanship for a period of not less than <u>ONE (1)</u> year from the date of Final Completion. Contractor shall guarantee that the materials provided shall be free from any defects for the longer of: (1) <u>ONE (1)</u> year from the date of Final Completion; or (2) the period of warranty provided by any supplier or



manufacturer. All written manufacturers' warranties for materials supplied must be provided to the City Project Manager before final payment will be authorized.

- 11. **PERFORMANCE EVALUATION**. At the end of the contract, City may evaluate Contractor's performance. Any such evaluation will become public record.
- 12. **NOTICE REGARDING FAILURE TO FULFILL AGREEMENT**. Any contractor who enters into an Agreement with the City of Ocala and fails to complete the contract term, for any reason, shall be subject to future bidding suspension for a period of **ONE (1)** year and bid debarment for a period of up to **THREE (3)** years for serious contract failures.
- 13. CONTRACTOR REPRESENTATIONS. Contractor expressly represents that:
 - A. Contractor has read and is fully familiar with all the terms and conditions of this Agreement, the Contract Documents, and other related data and acknowledges that they are sufficient in scope and detail to indicate and convey understanding of all terms and conditions of the work to be performed by Contractor under this Agreement.
 - B. Contractor has disclosed, in writing, all known conflicts, errors, inconsistencies, discrepancies, or omissions discovered by Contractor in the Contract Documents, and that the City's written resolution of same is acceptable to Contractor.
 - C. Contractor has had an opportunity to visit, has visited, or has had an opportunity to examine and ask questions regarding the sites upon which the work is to be performed and is satisfied with the site conditions that may affect cost, progress, and performance of the work, as observable or determinable by Contractor's own investigation.
 - D. Contractor is satisfied with the site conditions that may affect cost, progress, and performance of the work, as observable or determinable by Contractor's own investigation.
 - E. Contractor is familiar with all local, state, and Federal laws, regulations, and ordinances which may affect cost, progress, or its performance under this Agreement whatsoever.
 - F. **Public Entity Crimes.** Neither Contractor, its parent corporations, subsidiaries, members, shareholders, partners, officers, directors or executives, nor any of its affiliates, contractors, suppliers, subcontractors, or consultants under this Agreement have been placed on the convicted vendor list following a conviction of a public entity crime. Contractor understands that a "public entity crime" as defined in section 287.133(1)(g), Florida Statutes, is "a violation of any state or federal law by a person with respect to and directly related to the transaction of business with any public entity or with an agency or political subdivision of any other state or with the United States..." Contractor further understands



that any person or affiliate who has been placed on the convicted vendor list following a conviction for a public entity crime: (1) may not submit a bid, proposal, or reply on a contract: (a) to provide any goods or services to a public entity; (b) for the construction or repair of a public building or public work; or (c) for leases of real property to a public entity; (2) may not be awarded or perform work as a contractor, supplier, subcontractor, or consultant under a contract with any public entity; and (3) may not transact business with any public entity in excess of the threshold amount provided in section 287.017, Florida Statutes, for CATEGORY TWO for a period of 36 months from the date of being placed on the convicted vendor list.

- 14. **CONTRACTOR RESPONSIBILITIES**. Except as otherwise specifically provided for in this Agreement, the following provisions are the responsibility of the Contractor:
 - A. Contractor shall competently and efficiently supervise, inspect, and direct all work to be performed under this Agreement, devoting such attention thereto and applying such skills and expertise as may be necessary to perform the work in accordance with the Contract Documents.
 - B. Contractor shall be solely responsible for the means, methods, techniques, sequences, or procedures of construction and safety precautions or programs incident thereto.
 - C. Contractor shall be responsible to see that the finished work complies accurately with the contract and the intent thereof.
 - D. Contractor shall comply with all local, state, and Federal laws, regulations, and ordinances which may affect cost, progress, or its performance under this Agreement, including, but not limited to obtaining all permits, licenses, and other authorizations necessary for the prosecution of the work and be responsible for all costs associated with same.
 - E. Contractor shall operate and cause all construction equipment and materials supplied for or intended to be utilized in the Project to be operated and stored in only those areas prescribed by City. This includes the operations of workmen.
 - F. Contractor shall be fully responsible for receipt, inspection, acceptance, handling, and storage of all construction equipment and materials supplied for or intended to be utilized in the Project, whether furnished by Contractor or City. Contractor shall be responsible for providing adequate safeguards to prevent loss, theft, damage, or commingling with other materials or projects.



- G. Contractor shall continue its performance under this Agreement during the pendency of any dispute or disagreement arising out of or relating to this Agreement, except as Contractor and City may otherwise agree in writing.
- 15. **NO EXCLUSIVITY**. It is expressly understood and agreed by the parties that this is not an exclusive agreement. Nothing in this Agreement shall be construed as creating any exclusive arrangement with Contractor or as prohibit City from either acquiring similar, equal, or like goods and/or services or from executing additional contracts with other entities or sources.
- 16. **RIGHT OF ACCESS AND OTHER WORK PERFORMED BY THIRD-PARTIES**. City may perform additional work related to the Project itself, or have additional work performed by utility service companies, or let other direct contracts therefore which shall contain General Conditions similar to these. Contractor shall afford the utility service companies and the other contractors who are parties to such direct contracts (or City, if City is performing the additional work with City's employees) reasonable opportunity for the introduction and storage of materials and equipment and the execution of work and shall properly connect and coordinate his work with theirs.
 - A. If any part of Contractor's work depends for proper execution or results upon the work of any such other contractor or utility service company (or City), Contractor shall inspect and promptly report to City in writing any latent or apparent defects or deficiencies in such work that render it unsuitable for such proper execution and results. Contractor's failure to so report shall constitute an acceptance of the other work as fit and proper for integration with Contractor's work except for latent or non-apparent defects and deficiencies in the other work.
 - B. Contractor shall do all cutting, fitting, and patching of work that may be required to make the parts come together properly and integrate with such other work. Contractor shall not endanger any work of others by cutting, excavating, or otherwise altering their work, and will only cut or alter their work with the written consent of City.
- 17. **STORAGE OF MATERIALS/EQUIPMENT**. Contractor shall be fully responsible for receipt, inspection, acceptance, handling, and storage of equipment and materials (whether furnished by Contractor or City) to be utilized in the performance of or incorporated into the work.
- 18. RESPONSIBILITIES OF CITY. City or its representative shall issue all communications to Contractor. City has the authority to request changes in the work in accordance with the terms of this Agreement and with the terms in Exhibit A – Scope of Work. City has the authority to stop work or to suspend any work.



- 19. **COMMERCIAL AUTO LIABILITY INSURANCE.** Contractor shall procure and maintain, for the life of this Agreement, commercial auto liability insurance covering all automobiles owned, non-owned, hired, and scheduled by Contractor with a combined limit of not less than One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000) for bodily injury and property damage for each accident. Contractor's commercial automobile liability insurance policy must name, as additional insured, the City of Ocala, a political subdivision of the State of Florida, and its officials, employees, and volunteers.
- 20. **COMMERCIAL GENERAL LIABILITY INSURANCE.** Contractor shall procure and maintain, for the life of this Agreement, commercial general liability insurance with minimum coverage limits not less than:
 - A. One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000) per occurrence and Two Million Dollars (\$2,000,000) aggregate limit for bodily injury, property damage, and personal injury, and advertising injury; and
 - B. One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000) per occurrence and Two Million Dollars (\$2,000,000) aggregate limit for contractual liability, products and completed operations, independent contractors, and property in the care, control or custody of the Contractor.
 - C. Contractor's commercial general liability insurance policy shall include Endorsement CG 20 10 11 85, or equivalent, naming as an additional insured the City of Ocala, a political subdivision of the State of Florida, and its officials, employees, and volunteers. The coverage shall contain no special limitation on the scope of protection afforded to City, its officials, employees, or volunteers.
- 21. WORKERS' COMPENSATION AND EMPLOYER'S LIABILITY COVERAGE. Contractor shall procure and maintain, for the life of this Agreement, Workers' Compensation insurance and employer's liability insurance in amounts required by applicable statutes. Contractor shall ensure any and all subcontractors have coverage as required by applicable statutes. City requires policies under this section to be endorsed to waive the insurer's right to subrogate against City and its officials, employees, volunteers by including a Waiver of Our Right to Recover from Others Endorsement (WC 00 03 13). Exceptions and exemptions may be allowed by City's HR/Risk Director, so long as they are in accordance with Florida Statute.

22. MISCELLANEOUS INSURANCE PROVISIONS.

A. <u>Insurance Requirements.</u> These insurance requirements shall not relieve or limit the liability of Contractor. City does not in any way represent that these types or amounts of insurance are sufficient or adequate to protect Contractor's interests or liabilities but are merely minimums. No insurance is provided by the City under this contract to cover



Contractor. **No work shall be commenced under this contract until the required Certificate(s) of Insurance have been provided**. Work shall not continue after expiration (or cancellation) of the Certificates of Insurance and shall not resume until new Certificate(s) of Insurance have been provided. Insurance written on a "Claims Made" form is not acceptable without consultation with City of Ocala Risk Management.

- B. <u>Deductibles</u>. Contractor is responsible for the amount of any deductible or self-insured retention. Contractor's deductibles/self-insured retentions shall be disclosed to the City and may be disapproved by City.
- C. <u>Certificates of Insurance</u>. Contractor shall provide a Certificate of insurance, issued by an agency authorized to do business in the State of Florida and with an A.M. Best rating* of at least an A, showing the "City of Ocala" as an Additional Insured. Shown on the certificate at the certificate holder should be: City of Ocala, Contracting Department, Third Floor, 110 SE Watula Avenue, Ocala, FL 34471. Renewal certificates must also be forwarded to the Contracting Department prior to the policy expiration. <u>TEN (10)</u> days written notice must be provided to the City in the event of cancellation.

*Non-rated insurers must be pre-approved by the City Risk Manager.

- D. <u>Failure to Maintain Coverage</u>. In the event Contractor fails to disclose each applicable deductible/self-insured retention or obtain or maintain in full force and effect any insurance coverage required to be obtained by Contractor under this Agreement, Contractor shall be considered to be in default of this Agreement.
- E. <u>Severability of Interests.</u> Contractor shall arrange for its liability insurance to include General Liability, Business Automobile Liability, and Excess/Umbrella Insurance, or to be endorsed to include a severability of interests/cross liability provision so that the "City of Ocala" (where named as an additional insured) will be treated as if a separate policy were in existence, but without increasing the policy limits.
- 23. **SAFETY/ENVIRONMENTAL.** Contractor shall be responsible for initiating, maintaining, and supervising all safety precautions and programs in connection with the Work. Contractor shall make an effort to detect hazardous conditions and shall take prompt action where necessary to avoid accident, injury or property damage. EPA, DEP, OSHA and all other applicable safety laws and ordinances shall be followed as well as American National Standards Institute Safety Standards. Contractor shall take all necessary precautions for the safety of, and shall provide the necessary protection to prevent damage, injury, or loss to:



- A. All employees on the work and other persons that may be affected thereby;
- B. All work, materials and equipment to be incorporated therein, whether in storage on or off the site; and
- C. Other property at the site or adjacent thereto, including trees, shrubs, lawns, walks, pavements, roadways, structures, and utilities not designated for removal, relocation, or replacement in the course of construction.

All, injury, or loss to any property caused, directly or indirectly, in whole or in part, by Contractor, any subcontractor, or anyone directly or indirectly employed by any of them, or anyone for whose acts any of them may be liable, shall be remedied by Contractor. Contractor's duties and responsibilities for the safety and protection of the work shall continue until such time as the work is completed and accepted by City.

- 24. **TRAFFIC CONTROL AND BARRICADES.** The Contractor shall mitigate impact on local traffic conditions to all extents possible. The Contractor is responsible for establishing and maintaining appropriate traffic control and barricades. The Contractor shall provide sufficient signing, flagging and barricading to ensure the safety of vehicular and pedestrian traffic at all locations where work is being done under this Agreement.
 - A. In addition to the requirements set forth in bid, the Contractor shall maintain at all times a good and sufficient fence, railing or barrier around all exposed portions of said work in such a manner as to warn vehicular and pedestrian traffic of hazardous conditions.
 - B. Should Contractor fail to properly barricade his work or stored material sites in the manner outlined above, the City may have the necessary barricading done, and all cost incurred for said barricading shall be charged to the Contractor.
- 25. WORK SITE AND CLEANUP. Daily, during the progress of the work, Contractor shall keep the premises free from accumulations of waste materials, rubbish, and all other debris resulting from the work. At the completion of the work, Contractor shall remove all waste materials, rubbish, and debris from and about the premises, as well as all tools, appliances, construction equipment and machinery, and surplus materials, and shall leave the site clean and ready for occupancy by City. Contractor shall provide an inventory listing of all surplus materials in an area designated by City. Contractor shall restore to their original condition those portions of the site not designated or alteration by the Contract.
- 26. **COMPLIANCE WITH F.S. 287.135.** City may terminate Agreement immediately upon discovering that Contractor: (A) has been placed on the Scrutinized Companies that Boycott Israel List; (B) is engaged in a boycott of Israel; (C) has been placed on the Scrutinized



Companies with Activities in Sudan List; (D) has been placed on the Scrutinized Companies with Activities in the Iran Petroleum Energy Sector List; or (E) has been engaged in business operations in Cuba or Syria. This Agreement may also be terminated immediately if the Contractor falsely certified they are eligible to bid and contract with local government entities under F.S. 287.135

- 27. NON-DISCRIMINATORY EMPLOYMENT PRACTICES. During the performance of the contract, the Contractor shall not discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of race, color, religion, ancestry, national origin, sex, pregnancy, age, disability, sexual orientation, gender identity, marital or domestic partner status, familial status, or veteran status and shall take affirmative action to ensure that an employee or applicant is afforded equal employment opportunities without discrimination. Such action shall be taken with reference to, but not limited to: recruitment, employment, termination, rates of pay or other forms of compensation and selection for training or retraining, including apprenticeship and on-the-job training.
- 28. **SUBCONTRACTORS.** Nothing in this Agreement shall be construed to create, impose, or give rise to any duty owed by City or its representatives to any subcontractor of Contractor or any other persons or organizations having a direct contract with Contractor, nor shall it create any obligation on the part of City or its representatives to pay or seek payment of any monies to any subcontractor of Contractor or any other persons or organizations having a direct contract with Contractor, except as may otherwise be required by law. City shall not be responsible for the acts or omissions of any Contractor, subcontractor, or of any of their agents or employees, nor shall it create any obligation on the part of City or its representatives to any subcontractor or other person or organization, except as may otherwise be required by law.
- 29. **EMERGENCIES**. In an emergency affecting the welfare and safety of life or property, Contractor, without special instruction or authorization from the City Project Manager, is hereby permitted, authorized and directed to act at its own discretion to prevent threatened loss or injury. Except in the case of an emergency requiring immediate remedial work, any work performed after regular working hours, on Saturdays, Sundays or legal holidays, shall be performed without additional expense to the City unless such work has been specifically requested and approved by the City Project Manager. Contractor shall be required to provide to the City Project Manager with the names, addresses and telephone numbers of those representatives who can be contacted at any time in case of emergency. Contractor's emergency representatives must be fully authorized and equipped to correct unsafe or excessively inconvenient conditions on short notice by City or public inspectors.



- 30. **INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR STATUS.** Contractor acknowledges and agrees that under this Agreement, Contractor and any agent or employee of Contractor shall be deemed at all times to be an independent contractor and shall be wholly responsible for the manner in which it performs the services and work required under this Agreement. Neither Contractor nor its agents or employees shall represent or hold themselves out to be employees of City at any time. Neither Contractor nor its agents or employees shall constitute or be construed to create any intent on the part of either party to create an agency relationship, partnership, employer-employee relationship, joint venture relationship, or any other relationship which would allow City to exercise control or discretion over the manner or methods employed by Contractor in its performance of its obligations under this Agreement.
- 31. **ACCESS TO FACILITIES.** City shall provide Contractor with access to all City facilities as is reasonably necessary for Contractor to perform its obligations under this Agreement.
- 32. **ASSIGNMENT.** Neither party may assign its rights or obligations under this Agreement to any third party without the prior express approval of the other party, which shall not be unreasonably withheld.
- 33. **RIGHT OF CITY TO TAKE OVER CONTRACT.** Should the work to be performed by Contractor under this Agreement be abandoned, or should Contractor become insolvent, or if Contractor shall assign or sublet the work to be performed hereunder without the written consent of City, the City Project Manager shall have the power and right to hire and acquire additional men and equipment, supply additional material, and perform such work as deemed necessary for the completion of this Agreement. Under these circumstances, all expenses and costs actually incurred by City to accomplish such completion shall be credited to City along with amounts attributable to any other elements of damage and certified by the Project Manager. The City Project Manager's certification as to the amount of such liability shall be final and conclusive.
- 34. **PUBLIC RECORDS.** The Contractor shall comply with all applicable provisions of the Florida Public Records Act, Chapter 119, Florida Statutes. Specifically, the Contractor shall:
 - A. Keep and maintain public records required by the public agency to perform the service.
 - B. Upon request from the public agency's custodian of public records, provide the public agency with a copy of the requested records or allow the records to be inspected or copied within a reasonable time at a cost that does not exceed the cost provided in Chapter 119, Florida Statutes, or as otherwise provided by law.



- C. Ensure that public records that are exempt or confidential and exempt from public records disclosure requirements are not disclosed except as authorized by law for the duration of the contract term and following completion of the contract if the Contractor does not transfer the records to the public agency.
- D. Upon completion of the contract, transfer, at no cost, to the public agency all public records in possession of the Contractor or keep and maintain public records required by the public agency to perform the service. If the Contractor transfers all public records to the public agency upon completion of the contract, the Contractor shall destroy any duplicate public records that are exempt or confidential and exempt from public records disclosure requirements. If the Contractor keeps and maintains public records upon completion of the contract, the Contractor lectrons for retaining public records. All records stored electronically must be provided to the public agency, upon request from the public agency's custodian of public records, in a format that is compatible with the information technology systems of the public agency.

- 35. **AUDIT.** Contractor shall comply and cooperate immediately with any inspections, reviews, investigations, or audits relating to this Agreement as deemed necessary by the Florida Office of the Inspector General, the City's Internal or External auditors or by any other Florida official with proper authority.
- 36. **PUBLICITY.** Contractor shall not use City's name, logo, seal or other likeness in any press release, marketing materials, or other public announcement without City's prior written approval.
- 37. **E-VERIFY.** In accordance with Executive Order 11-116, Contractor shall utilize the U.S. Agency of Homeland Security's E-Verify system, <u>https://e-verify.uscis.gov/emp</u>, to verify the employment eligibility of all employees hired during the term of this Agreement. Contractor



shall also require all subcontractors performing work under this Agreement to utilize the E-Verify system for any employees they may hire during the term of this Agreement.

- 38. **CONFLICT OF INTEREST.** Contractor is required to have disclosed, with the submission of their bid, the name of any officer, director, or agent who may be employed by the City. Contractor shall further disclose the name of any City employee who owns, directly or indirectly, any interest in Contractor's business or any affiliated business entity. Any additional conflicts of interest that may occur during the contract term must be disclosed to the City of Ocala Procurement Department.
- 39. **WAIVER.** The failure or delay of any party at any time to require performance by another party of any provision of this Agreement, even if known, shall not affect the right of such party to require performance of that provision or to exercise any right, power or remedy hereunder. Any waiver by any party of any breach of any provision of this Agreement should not be construed as a waiver of any continuing or succeeding breach of such provision, a waiver of the provision itself, or a waiver of any right, power or remedy under this Agreement. No notice to or demand on any party in any circumstance shall, of itself, entitle such party to any other or further notice or demand in similar or other circumstances.
- 40. **SEVERABILITY OF ILLEGAL PROVISIONS.** Wherever possible, each provision of this Agreement shall be interpreted in such a manner as to be effective and valid under the applicable law. Should any portion of this Agreement be declared invalid for any reason, such declaration shall have no effect upon the remaining portions of this Agreement.
- 41. **INDEMNITY.** Contractor shall indemnify City and its elected officials, employees and volunteers against, and hold City and its elected officials, employees and volunteers harmless from, all damages, claims, losses, costs, and expenses, including reasonable attorneys' fees, which City or its elected officials, employees or volunteers may sustain, or which may be asserted against City or its elected officials, employees or volunteers, arising out of the activities contemplated by this Agreement including, without limitation, harm or personal injury to third persons during the term of this Agreement to the extent attributable to the actions of Contractor, its agents, and employees.
- 42. **NO WAIVER OF SOVEREIGN IMMUNITY.** Nothing herein is intended to waive sovereign immunity by the City to which sovereign immunity may be applicable, or of any rights or limits of liability existing under Florida Statute § 768.28. This term shall survive the termination of all performance or obligations under this Agreement and shall be fully binding until any proceeding brought under this Agreement is barred by any applicable statute of limitations.

Any civil action or legal proceeding arising out of or relating to this Agreement shall be brought only in the courts of record of the State of Florida in Marion County or the United States District Court, Middle District of Florida, Ocala Division. Each party consents to the exclusive jurisdiction of such court in any such civil action or legal proceeding in such court and/or the laying of venue of any such civil action or legal proceeding in such court paper may be effected on such party by mail, as provided in this Agreement, or in such other manner as may be provided under applicable laws, rules of procedures or local rules.

Contractor shall provide all materials, labor, supervision, tools, accessories, equipment, permits, certifications, incidentals and all other things necessary for Contractor's provision of stormwater pipe video inspection, cleaning, ground penetrating radar (GPR), and grout sealing services along City rights-of-way, roadways, easements and other sites deemed necessary by the City's Stormwater Manager, or designee.

City Project Manager and Contact Information for Contractor

All work shall be coordinated through the City Project Manager, Brian Herrick, (352) 857-9353, E-mail: <u>BHerrick@Ocalafl.org</u>.

Contractor must provide a valid telephone number and address to the City Project Manager. The phone must be answered during normal working hours, or voicemail must be available to leave a message.

General Requirements

The work shall generally consist of:

- Providing all labor, materials, equipment and incidentals to inspect, video, clean and seal existing storm water pipes.
- All work shall conform to the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) "Standard Specifications for Road and Bridge Construction", most current edition, unless otherwise specified herein. FDOT Standard Specifications for Road and Bridge Construction can be obtained from: <u>http://www.dot.state.fl.us/programmanagement/Implemented/SpecBooks/</u>

Video Inspection

Stormwater conveyance systems selected solely for video inspection services shall be cleaned prior by City staff. Areas designated for inspection and cleaning or repairs shall be videotape inspected prior to and at the time of completion of the requested service. A detailed report including video, drawing of actual site conditions, size of pipes, linear footage, manholes found, pictures and recommendation (with proposed repair points) must be submitted as a complete package to the City for review after completion of video inspection. All videotapes, DVD's, computer files and reports under this contract will become the property of the City of Ocala and shall be surrendered to the City's Project Manager or designee upon completion of the requested work prior to invoice payment.

Ground Penetrating Radar

The GPR system will be used for void detection in subsurface over and around various storm structures and pipes. GPR system will scan the surface above structures to determine areas of subsurface in need of stabilization. In addition, GPR will be used for storm pipe void detection. Three passes will be made above the entire length of the pipe. A pass will be made one foot (1') to the left of the pipe, one foot (1') to the right of the pipe and a pass will be made directly over top of the pipe.

The data gathered from the job site will be stored on a flash drive. A report will be generated locating and sizing any suspect void locations.

Soil Stabilization

Compaction (soil stabilization) with sand, cement grout mixture includes the installation of injection pipes. The location of the compaction grouting will be identified using GPR to locate area in need of soil stabilization. The responsibilities of the Contractor include project control, supervision, labor, materials and equipment to accomplish the following items of work:

- Submit a detailed grouting plan to the City's Project Manager or designee for review prior to beginning any work.
- Install grout pipes.
- Monitor ground and existing structure movements during grouting operations.
- Perform grouting program under the supervision of personnel experienced in grouting for settlement control.
- Locate and protect all utilities prior to construction or repair.

Equipment used shall be specifically designed for compensation grouting. Because of the high pressure involved, all equipment, including hoses, couplings, gauges and pipes, shall be able to safely operate at the maximum grouting pressures. The mixing and grout pump system shall be designed to provide continuous flow of the grout mixture at variable flow rates and

pressures without interruption during any single hookup or stage due to inadequate batching or pump feed capacity.

The grout mixing system shall be capable of thoroughly mixing grout over the specified range. Grout shall either be supplied by transit mix or mixed on site. On-site mixing systems shall be capable of precisely measuring, recording, and mixing all materials.

The grout pump shall include a positive displacement type pump with variable speed capabilities. The grout pump shall have the capability of injecting grout at a pressure of 240 psi. The pump shall have a minimum capacity of 10 GPM and maximum of up to 45 GPM. Pumps shall be equipped with remote controls for operation in vicinity of the probe collar to control the injection process.

There shall be a reliable mechanical means of measuring the quantity of grout pumped in every stage to within 0.25 cubic feet.

Emergency Work

- 1. In the event that a stormwater system is in danger of failing or has failed, a void is detected under the paved road and a possibility of the road collapsing exist and a potential danger to the public exists, etc., the City Project Manager or designee will provide the Contractor with clear and concise verbal or written instructions and expect Contractor to proceed immediately with repairs.
- 2. A work order for such emergency work shall be processed as soon as possible.
- All emergency calls must be responded to within three (3) hours. The Contractor must have the necessary equipment and personnel on the specified project site within the three (3) hour time frame.

Measurement and Payment

All measurements for payments will be based on the completed work performed in strict accordance with drawings and specifications. All work completed under this Contract will be measured by the Contractor in the presence of the City's Project Manager or designee. The unit prices provided in Exhibit B – Price Proposal will constitute full compensation for the work completed.

Work Order Process

- 1. Contractor shall submit a work schedule prior to beginning any work order.
- 2. Contractor shall consult with the City's Project Manager or designee prior to any schedule variance. City's Project Manager or designee shall be notified twenty-four (24) hours prior to the schedule change and must concur with the recommended changes.
- Contractor shall notify all residents within the work areas to when the work will take place and the level of inconvenience that will be involved. This notification shall take place five (5) days prior to commencement of work in that area.
- 4. Any damage to sidewalks, driveways, curbs, asphalt pavement or private property caused by the Contractor shall be corrected by the Contractor, by replacing the entire affected area/item (at no cost to the City) prior to submitting any invoices.
- 5. Upon written notice from the Contractor that work required under a Work Order is completed, the City's Project Manager or designee will make a final inspection with the Contractor and will notify the Contractor in writing of any deficiencies in the project. The Contractor will correct all deficiencies within seven (7) work days after notification.
- 6. The Contractor shall dispose of debris only in an approved landfill or permitted facility in accordance with all Federal, State and Local rules and regulations in effect at the time of disposal. Cost involved with the disposal of debris shall be the responsibility of the Contractor.
- 7. The Contractor shall leave work sites in a clean condition free from excess materials, rubbish and debris prior to submitting any invoices.

Maintenance of Traffic

- 1. Contractor shall be responsible for maintenance of traffic per FDOT Series Index 600 (latest edition), within the limits of the project, for the duration of the construction period, including any temporary suspensions of the work. FDOT Design Standards are the minimum standards for the use in the development of all Traffic Control Plans (TCPs).
- 2. Contractor shall construct and maintain detours.
- 3. Contractor shall provide facilities for access to residences, businesses, etc., along the project.

- 4. Contractor shall furnish, install and maintain traffic control and safety devices during construction.
- 5. Contractor shall furnish and install work zone pavement markings for maintenance of traffic (MOT) in construction areas.
- 6. Contractor shall provide any other special requirements for safe and expeditious movement of traffic specified in the plans.
- 7. MOT shall include all facilities, devices and operations as required for safety and convenience of the public within the work zone.
- 8. Contractor shall not be required to maintain traffic over those portions of the project where no work is to be accomplished or where construction operations will not affect existing roads.
- 9. Contractor shall not obstruct or create a hazard to any traffic during the performance of the work, and must repair any damage to existing pavement open to traffic.
- 10. Contractor's line item for asphalt, as set forth in Exhibit B Price Proposal, includes the costs for any work that is necessary for Contractor to meet the requirements herein.

Mobilization

- 1. Mobilization shall include the obtaining of required permits and the moving of the Contractor's operations and equipment required for construction.
- 2. Contractor shall provide on-site sanitary facilities as required by state and local laws.
- 3. Contractor will not be permitted to use City-owned sanitary facilities during construction.
- 4. Contractor shall be responsible for the posting of OSHA required notices and establishing of safety programs and procedures.

Erosion Sediment and Flood Control

Contractor shall be responsible for providing, maintaining, and operating temporary facilities to control erosion and sediment, and to protect work and existing facilities from flooding during construction. Contractor shall be required to maintain drainage ways and construct temporary drainage facilities to allow runoff to flow properly.

Cleaning During Construction

- 1. The use of water to prevent the blowing of dust and debris during operations is mandatory.
- 2. Contractor shall be required to sweep all roadways affected by the construction and where adjacent to work, at least twice weekly.
- 3. Contractor shall be required to provide approved containers for collection and disposal of waste materials, debris, and rubbish.
- 4. Contractor shall be required to dispose of waste materials, debris, and rubbish off-site at least once weekly.

Submittals

- 1. Contractor shall provide submittals as required by City of Ocala Standard Specifications.
- 2. Contractor shall submit copies of permits and approvals for construction as required by laws and regulations of governing agencies.
- 3. Contractor shall submit temporary construction parking area plans, storage yard, storage trailer location, staging area plan, and plan for disposal of waste materials.

Final Cleaning

- 1. Upon completion of work, Contractor shall clean entire work and project site as applicable.
- 2. Contractor shall leave the work and adjacent areas affected in a cleaned condition satisfactory to the City Project Manager or designee.
- 3. Contractor shall remove any foreign materials from exposed surfaces.
- 4. Contractor shall broom clean exterior paved driveways and parking areas.
- 5. Contractor shall hose clean sidewalks and concrete exposed surfaces.

Construction Work Areas

Components of the project, including temporary work and storage areas, will be located onsite per project. **Utilizing private property without written permission is prohibited.** Staging areas will be sited inside the right-of-way or within City property. Material will be transported to the proper station for construction, assembly, response to possible public concern.

Normal Work Hours

- 1. The City's normal working hours are Monday through Friday from 7:00 a.m. to 5:30 p.m.
- 2. No work will be permitted on City-observed holidays.
- If additional hours outside of normal working hours are necessary, Contractor must give 48 hours advance notice to the Project Manager. The City reserves the right to decline any such request.
- 4. Night work may be permitted if it would result in less impact to the public or reduced safety issues at no extra cost to City.
- 5. Contractor must submit a project schedule to the City Project Manager for approval.
- 6. **Weather Days:** Contractor shall submit a written request to the City Project Manager (email is the preferred method) for additional days for which work is suspended or delayed by weather. Weather days shall be reconciled with each monthly pay application for the time period which the application is submitted and shall be final. Contractor performance and execution of work will be considered in the determination for granting additional days.
