

Solicitation Title: Citywide Tree Trimming and Removal Services

SECTION 1. DEFINITIONS – Additional Info.

- 1. **Diameter Breast Height (DBH):** The Contractor must physically measure the distance of the tree trunk at four and a half feet (4.5') above the ground on the tree's uphill side (if not on even ground).
 - A. If the tree forks below or bulges at 4.5', measure the circumference where the tree reaches normal size or tapers below 4.5'.
 - B. For accurate measurement, use a diameter tape or regular tape measure.



- 2. **Hauling:** does not apply to tree removal (lines 1-15 of **Exhibit B Price Proposal)**. Instead, hauling (lines 21-22 of **Exhibit B Price Proposal)** applies ONLY to the hauling of debris.
- 3. **Diameter:** The Contractor must physically measure the length of the line that cuts any straight-line segment that passes through the center of the circle. The measurement for diameter is at four and a half feet (4.5) above ground on the tree's uphill side (if not on even ground).

SECTION 2. INVOICING - Clarification

1. Retention ponds may not have complete addresses. Include cross street or block number of the location on invoice.

SECTION 3. TREE TRIMMING – Additional Info.

- 1. The City's horticulturist will review the proper ways of trimming Crepe Myrtle trees with the Contractor on location, at the time of service.
- 2. Palm Tree trimming may include boot removal.

SECTION 4. TREE LIGHTING - Clarification

1. The City implements tree trimming preparation for holiday lighting in August through September.

2. If the City implements year-round tree lighting, a lift must be used when trimming. Special care must be taken to avoid damaging lights.

SECTION 5. PERMITS – Clarification

- 1. The Contractor will pull all road permits for scheduled lane & road closures.
- 2. The Project Manager will advise Contractor of permit requirements at the time of performing emergency or disaster services.

SECTION 6. EQUIPMENT – Clarification

1. "Mulcher" is also known as "Chipper".
